1734-36 Walnut St. is a two-story frame vernacular residential building. It embodies the historic and architectural qualities of the Springfield neighborhood through its period of construction, its design, its historical associations and its integrity.

Constructed 1906, it was originally built by F. C. Miller. The first resident was Charles M. Stoddard, a clerk. Charles V. Imeson, the influential Jacksonville City Engineer lived here from 1925-1930. Imeson worked on the Hogans Creek Project with H. J. Klutho in 1929.
