423 E. 1st St. is a two-story Eastlake multi-family residential building. It is noteworthy for its abundance of decorative wood trim. It embodies the historic and architectural qualities of the Springfield neighborhood through its period of construction, its design, its historical associations and its integrity.

Constructed c. 1897, it was originally the residence of James Rosser, an auditor with J. E. Bryan & Company. In 1913, Ethel Rosser was a collector with the First National Bank of Florida. Its subsequent owners included Clarence H. Gooding in 1930, listed as a soldier. A two story frame garage and servants quarters was built in 1929 in the rear, by C. H. Gooding.
